



## THAILAND: KEY TRADING PARTNER WITH THE UNITED STATES FOR 178 YEARS

#### In 2010:

- 24<sup>th</sup> largest U.S. trading partner, with bilateral goods trade of <u>\$31 billion</u>
- 28<sup>th</sup> largest export market for U.S. goods.
- 19<sup>th</sup> with respect to goods imported by the U.S.
- 16<sup>th</sup> largest U.S. export market for agricultural products
  - leading U.S. exports to Thailand include rice, soybeans, wheat, wheat flour, and vegetable oil.



## THAILAND IS A MAJOR DESTINATION FOR U.S. FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT FOR MANY REASONS, INCLUDING PROTECTION OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY:

- U.S. investment (FDI) in Thailand totaled \$11.2 billion in 2010, up from \$7.6 billion in 2004.
- U.S. FDI in Thailand is concentrated in manufacturing, finance, and insurance.
- Thailand's investment of FDI in the United States was \$220 million in 2009, up from \$153 million in 2004.



Thailand's robust economic growth has created numerous opportunities for U.S. foreign direct investment in a number of infrastructure sectors, including electrical power, transportation, and renewable energy. Here are some of the familiar U.S. brands that have come to Thailand:



## Thai-U.S. Trade Relationship: U.S. Exports






Last year, <u>U.S. exports to Thailand grew by 30 percent</u>, almost double the U.S. growth rate needed to meet the President Obama's objective of doubling U.S. exports in five years!

#### **Exports from U.S. States to Thailand**








#### 2010 U.S. Exports to Thailand









San Diego companies exported nearly \$8 million in goods to Thailand in 2010. Exporters and the products they exported included:

- Major seafood companies, such as Silversea International, American Albacore Fishing and Bumble Bee export sardines, Pacific salmon, and a wide variety of other fish
- Parts for internal combustion engines for automobiles

## ASEAN Countries as a Destination for San Diego's Exports



San Diego companies exported \$ 20.3 million in goods to the ten ASEAN countries in 2010. Top exports (in order of value of exports) were:

- Sardines
- Gas turbines
- Parts for radios and navigational items
- Medicines in measured doses
- Frozen fish, including Pacific salmon
- Albacore or long-finned tuna
- Petroleum oil
- Frozen meat
- Chemical products
- Enzymes

- > Non-oil lubricating preparations
- Kitchen hoods with internal fans
- Motor engine parts
- Forage products, including rutabagas, hay, clover, and kale
- > Animal organs
- Toys and toy parts
- Animal feed preparations
- Ferrous waste and scrap
- Sweet cookies, waffles, and wafers



Because of duty-free market entry within the ASEAN countries, we invite you to invest in Thailand. Opportunities include:

Shipping product inputs duty-free into Thailand that can then be made into finished exports both to Thailand and to other ASEAN consumers;

> investing in Thai companies that, in partnership, could better serve the ASEAN market of 600 million people;

ASEAN Economic Community (AEC): Transforming ASEAN into a single market and production base by 2015

In 2010: Import duties on all goods eliminated for ASEAN-6 (Brunei Darussalam, Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore and Thailand)

In 2015: Removal of all restrictions on trade in services and full elimination of non-tariff barriers



Many products are shipped from San Diego to Thailand and to other ASEAN markets. These represent initial opportunities where Thailand could be used as an onward hub:

Sardines (\$6.3 million exported to Thailand and Malaysia)

Miscellaneous frozen fish (\$1.5 million exported to Thailand and Singapore)

Natural and synthetic vitamins in measured doses (\$5.4 million exported to Malaysia, Philippines and Vietnam

Lubricating preparations, petroleum, and bituminous oils (\$1.3 million exported to Brunei and Indonesia)


Gas turbines (\$3 million exported to Singapore and Indonesia)



FDI opportunities in Thailand for San Diego's strengths:

- Clean water technology
- Biotechnology and biomedical technology (3<sup>rd</sup> largest concentration in U.S.)
- Green economy (solar, biofuel)
- Educational partnerships (e.g., UCSD IRPS)
- Health care (e.g., Sauk Institute)

San Diego is a distribution hub for additional Thai exports, including Fords, Toyotas, and Isuzu cars; auto tires; a wide variety of kitchen appliances; debugging software; medical laboratory supplies; wiring harnesses for autos, boats, and planes; cables; and toys.
